Recipe of the Month

Gertíe's Blue Corn Bread & Muffins míx

Native peoples throughout the American Southwest have used corn (maize) in a variety of colors and know blue corn to be the most prized grain of the Pueblo tribes.

Blue corn meal is a finely ground whole grain that can be used in most recipes using regular corn meal.

You will need

1 cup Tamaya brand
blue cornmeal

1 cup Dobbin flour
(all-purpose flour)

2 tablespoons sugar

1 tablespoons baking
powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

2 large eggs

1 cup milk

1/4 cup butter or
margarine

Now Combine dry ingredients. Beat eggs with milk and blend in butter or margarine.

Stir liquids into dry mixture - just to moisten. Don't over do!

Spoon into muffin cups (2 1/2" size)
Bake in 400 oven until brown and inserted wooden tooth pick comes out clean The king enjoys these at his Royal breakfast.

ent tribes have different ways of explaining how the world was created. Her story was about a beautiful star maiden that fell out of the sky and landed on the back




